

Customer Service Advice from Telstra.

Extreme Weather events impact service in Northern Territory South

Telstra is working to manage the significant impact to Telstra services that has occurred as a result of a series of extreme weather events in the southern region of Northern Territory, on or about, Tuesday 23 February 2010 through to Thursday 25 February 2010.

Due to the effect of damage to the Telstra telecommunications network by a monsoonal trough and low, there has been a significant increase in the number of Telstra services being reported as faulty. As a result, there has been some disruption to service and delays to normal installation and repair activities.

Telstra apologises to any affected customers.

Information as to the nature of these severe weather events can be sourced from Weatherzone. Heavy rainfall and flash flooding referred to in Weatherzone media article Tuesday 23 February at 20:55; all of which were widely reported in the news media after the events.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances applies to approximately 222 services. This number may increase as Telstra assesses the full affect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of normal service operations is expected to be 10 March 2010. This date is indicative only; Telstra customers should anticipate that some further delays may occur. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are; in the area bounded by and including, but is not limited to the area starting at Lake Nash head directly east to the Northern Territory/Queensland border and follow the border south to Poeppel corner, then follow the Northern Territory/South Australian border west to Surveyor Generals corner, then follow the West Australian/Northern Territory border to the northern border of the Western desert. From the Western desert border go east to Mirrindi then south east to Jarra Jarra, then east southeast to Murray Downs station then east back to Lake Nash. All suburbs and towns serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an extension to time frames applying under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2000 (No.2)*. This means that Telstra is notifying customers that normal service time frames may not be met during the period of **26 February 2010** to

10 March 2010 inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice).
