

# Customer Service Advice from Telstra

## Extreme Weather events impact service in Darwin – Daly

Telstra is working to manage the significant impact to Telstra services that has occurred as a result of a series of extreme weather events in the Darwin –Daly region of the Northern Territory, on or about 10 December 2009, through to 13 December 2009.

Due to the effect of damage to the Telstra telecommunications network by severe thunderstorms, there has been a significant increase in the number of Telstra services being reported as faulty. As a result, there has been some disruption to service and delays to normal installation and repair activities.

Telstra apologises to any affected customers.

Information as to the nature of these severe weather events can be sourced from the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM). Damaging wind was referred to in the BOM Severe Weather Warning issued for Thursday 10 December 2009 initially at 7:51 pm, and was widely reported in the news media after the events.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances applies to approximately 747 services. This number may increase as Telstra assesses the full affect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of normal service operations is expected to be 23 December 2009. This date is indicative only; Telstra customers should anticipate that some further delays may occur. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are; in the area bounded by and including, but is not limited to the area starting at Ji-Marda, go southeast to Yathalmarra, south to Black Mountain, west to Hayes Creek, south to Victoria River and follow the Victoria Highway west to Timber Creek. From Timber Creek go northwest to Bradshaw, then follow the Victoria River west then northwest out to Queens Channel and follow the coastline north then northeast past Pearce Pt, Cape Scott and Darwin, then clockwise around Cobourg Peninsula, and follow the coastline east back to Ji-Marda. All suburbs, towns and off shore islands and coastal areas serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an extension to time frames applying under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2000 (No.2)*. This means that Telstra is notifying customers that normal service time frames may not be met during the period of **14 December 2009 to 23 December 2009** inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice).
